Join WTA in completing the "Westchester 100," a project inspired by the "Walkable Westchester" book by Jane and Walt Daniels. Listed above as Hikes 1 thru 99 are almost all of the hiking areas and trails mentioned in the book. We've assigned a value to each trail based on length. There are 91 "regular" hikes, with other shorter hikes given "a" and "b" designations because they are each equivalent to half a hike. Where multiple areas are listed next to a number (for example, 97b lists both Koegel and Reis Parks), all areas must be hiked to qualify. Depending on location, it's possible to complete more than one area at a time.

Hike No. 100a and 100b are two local parks not mentioned in "Walkable Westchester" as places to walk or hike. These areas - Hudson Park in New Rochelle and Flint Park in Mamaroneck - both offer delightful waterside strolls and can be explored when doing the hikes "Along the Sound" that are listed in the book.

Keep a record of the date and place of each hike you lead or participate in. Send us the list when you complete a total of 50 hikes, and you'll receive a certificate for your efforts; complete all 100 and you'll get a patch to proudly display on your pack.
